## + Job of Telmessos

**Archbishop Job of Telmessos** (Ihor Getcha) was born in <u>Montreal,Canada</u> (1974) in a family a family of Ukrainian émigrés and educated at <u>Collège Français</u> (Montreal) and the <u>University of Manitoba</u> (Winnipeg). He studied theology at St. Andrew's College (Manitoba) and the St. Sergius Orthodox Theological Institute (Paris) from which he was awarded a doctorate, jointly with the <u>Institut Catholique de Paris</u>, in 2003, with a thesis on "The liturgical reform of Metropolitan Cyprian of Kiev". He was ordained priest by Archbishop <u>Gabriel of Comane</u> in 2003. On January 9, 2004, he was raised to <u>hegumen</u>, and on July 18 the same year, to <u>archimandrite</u>. He has worked as a lecturer and professor of church history, liturgy and <u>canon law</u> at various academic institutions including St Sergius, of which he was dean from 2005 to 2007, the Institut Catholique, the<u>University of Fribourg</u>and, since 2009, the Orthodox Center of the Ecumenical Patriarchate in <u>Chambesy,Switzerland</u>. In November 2013 he was elected to lead the <u>Patriarchal Exarchate for Orthodox</u> Parishes of Russian Tradition in Western Europe; on 28 November 2015 the Holy Synod of the Ecumenical Patriarchate appointed him as the Patriarchate's representative to the <u>World Council of Churches</u> at <u>Geneva</u>. He has published *Le Typikon décripté. Manuel de théologie byzantine* (Paris, Cerf 2009), translated in English in 2012 (St Vladimir's Seminary Press, New York) with the title: *The Typikon Decoded*.
